

- The court approves, denies, or sets the matter for a hearing within **seven (7) court days** of the receipt of the completed JV-220 and JV-220(A) or (B) from the physician.
- If the court sets the matter for a hearing, the clerk of the court provides notice of the date, time, and location of the hearing **at least two (2) court days** before the hearing
